



### 7.3.2 SSAA Para Range Use Policy

<b>Range:</b>	Main Range
<b>No. Benches / Targets</b>	20
<b>Distances</b>	10m, 25m, 40m, 50m, 100m, 150m, 200m, 300yd
<b>Firearm Restrictions</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Range limited to rifles and pistols only.</li> <li>• Shotguns are not to be used on the main range. For pattern testing the shotgun shooter needs to access the Single Action 50m range or the shotgun range with a SSAA Para Range Officer and fire into the backstop.</li> <li>• High Powered Calibre Firearms list by SAPOL are not to be used at SSAA Para unless they are used under the direct supervision of a Range Officer with targets located within the 300m Bunker. Additional baffles are to be in place.</li> <li>• .50 BMG cannot be used at SSAA Para</li> <li>• The use of semi auto longarms or pump action shotguns (class c) are not permitted.</li> </ul>
<b>Usage Restrictions</b>	<p>This range is open to all Para members, SSAA members and Visitors, subject to the direction of an attending Range Officer or Caretaker as applicable.</p> <p>The use of the metallic silhouettes on the main range is only to be used by members who have completed the relevant training. Training endorsement is shown on the members membership card. Members and visitors can use the silhouettes under the supervision of the approved member.</p> <p>Registered programmed competitions have the right of use to the range over general practice activities. Sections are to try and accommodate shooters who want to sight in firearms if space is available.</p> <p>Shooters are <b>not</b> permitted to use the 300yd mound while a registered shotgun match is in progress. 300yd shooters are to check that the shotgun range is not in use prior to setting up targets.</p> <p>The use of the key tag system is mandatory for all shooters and visitors going forward of the firing line. The RO is to take the first key tag out to turn on the red light on and close the range. The RO will also be the last one to insert the key tag back in and declare the range open.</p> <p>All targets are to be set so that the projectiles impact the centre of the back stops.</p>



<b>Range:</b>	Turning Target Pistol Range
<b>No. Benches / Targets</b>	20 targets with 12 firing points
<b>Distances</b>	25m
<b>Firearm Restrictions</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• This range is limited to pistols only in category H1, H2, H3.</li> <li>• H4 pistols are permitted to be used only for black powder competitions</li> <li>• .22 Rifles for cadet training conditions can use the range</li> <li>• Pistol calibre and .22 lever actions of straight wall type and limited to a maximum velocity of 1400fps.</li> <li>• Shotguns and other rifles are not to be used.</li> </ul>
<b>Usage Restrictions</b>	<p>Range access is available to all Para members outside of competitions with the appropriate range access approval on their membership card.</p> <p>Para Members without range access approval, general SSAA members and visitors may only be permitted to use this range if under the supervision of a Para member with the appropriate range approval.</p> <p>Outside of match competitions, the use of the turning targets is only to be used by members who have training completed on their membership card. Non approved Members and visitors can use the turning targets under the supervision of the approved member.</p> <p>The use of the key tag system is mandatory for all shooters and visitors going forward of the firing line. The RO is to take the first key tag out to turn on the red light on and close the range. The RO will also be the last one to insert the key tag back in and declare the range open.</p> <p>Registered competitions have right of usage over general practice users.</p>



<b>Range:</b>	Slow Fire Pistol Range
<b>No. Benches / Targets</b>	16
<b>Distances</b>	25m
<b>Firearm Restrictions</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• This Range is limited to pistols only in category H1, H2, H3.</li><li>• H4 pistols are permitted to be used only for black powder competitions</li><li>• Shotguns and rifles are not to be used.</li></ul>
<b>Usage Restrictions</b>	<p>Range access is available to all Para members outside of competitions with the appropriate range access approval on their membership card.</p> <p>Para Members without range access approval, general SSAA members and visitors may only be permitted to use this range if under the supervision of a Para member with the appropriate range approval.</p> <p>The use of the key tag system is mandatory for all shooters and visitors going forward of the firing line. The RO is to take the first key tag out to turn on the red light on and close the range. The RO will also be the last one to insert the key tag back in and declare the range open.</p> <p>Registered competitions have right of usage over general practice users.</p>



<b>Range:</b>	Indoor Turning Target Pistol and Collector Club Range
<b>No. Benches / Targets</b>	7
<b>Distances</b>	25m
<b>Firearm Restrictions</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>This Range is limited pistols only in category H1, H2, H3</li> </ul>
<b>Usage Restrictions</b>	<p>Range access is available to all Para members outside of competitions with the appropriate range access approval on their membership card.</p> <p>Para Members without range access approval, general SSAA members and visitors may only be permitted to use this range if under the supervision of a Para member with the appropriate range approval.</p> <p>Outside of match competitions, the use of the turning targets is only to be used by members who have training completed on their membership card. Non approved Members and visitors can use the turning targets under the supervision of the approved member.</p> <p>The use of the key tag system is mandatory for all shooters and visitors going forward of the firing line. The RO is to take the first key tag out to turn on the red light on and close the range. The RO will also be the last one to insert the key tag back in and declare the range open.</p> <p>Registered competitions have right of usage over general practice users.</p>



<b>Range:</b>	Single Action & IPSC Ranges
<b>No. Benches / Targets</b>	Varies
<b>Distances</b>	7m to 50m
<b>Firearm Restrictions</b>	This Range is accredited for rifle, pistol and shotguns
<b>Usage Restrictions</b>	<p>Range access is available to all Para members outside of competitions with the appropriate range access approval on their membership card.</p> <p>Para Members without range access approval, general SSAA members and visitors may only be permitted to use this range if under the supervision of a Para member with the appropriate range approval.</p> <p>Outside of match competitions, the use of the IPSC/Single Action Equipment is only to be used by members who have training completed on their membership card. Non approved Members and visitors can use the equipment under the supervision of the approved member.</p> <p>The use of the key tag system is mandatory for all shooters and visitors going forward of the firing line. The RO is to take the first key tag out to turn on the red light on and close the range. The RO will also be the last one to insert the key tag back in and declare the range open.</p> <p>Registered competitions have right of usage over general practice users.</p> <p>Security training may use this range when an advanced booking is made under terms approved by Para Council.</p> <p>The 50m range for shotgun testing/patterns may only be used on bay 6 if a SSAA Para Range Officer is present to supervise. <i>Note: for pattern testing the shotgun shooter needs to fire directly into the backstop.</i></p> <p>Targets are to be placed directly in front of the backstops or approved bullet catches.</p> <p>Registered competitions have the right of usage over general practice users.</p>



<b>Range:</b>	50m Pistol / Running Target Range
<b>No. Benches / Targets</b>	8
<b>Distances</b>	50m
<b>Firearm Restrictions</b>	<p>This Range is accredited for</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Pistol calibre rifles of straight wall type and limited to a maximum velocity of 1400fps.</li> <li>• Black powder rifle</li> <li>• Rimfire rifle</li> <li>• Air Rifle</li> <li>• Category H1, H2, H3 Pistol</li> <li>• Category H4 in black powder pistol only</li> </ul>
<b>Usage Restrictions</b>	<p>Range access is available to all Para members outside of competitions with the appropriate range access approval on their membership card.</p> <p>Para Members without range access approval, general SSAA members and visitors may only be permitted to use this range if under the supervision of a Para member with the appropriate range approval.</p> <p>Outside of match competitions, the use of the Running Target Equipment is only to be used by members who have training completed on their membership card. Non approved Members and visitors can use the equipment under the supervision of the approved member.</p> <p>The use of the key tag system is mandatory for all shooters and visitors going forward of the firing line. The RO is to take the first key tag out to turn on the red light on and close the range. The RO will also be the last one to insert the key tag back in and declare the range open.</p> <p>Registered competitions have right of usage over general practice users.</p> <p>All targets are to be set so that the projectiles impact the centre of the back stops.</p>



<b>Range:</b>	Top Metallic Silhouette Range
<b>No. Benches / Targets</b>	Varies
<b>Distances</b>	10 to 100m
<b>Firearm Restrictions</b>	This Range is accredited for .22 Rifle Air Rifle Category H1, H2, Pistol
<b>Usage Restrictions</b>	<p>Range access is available to all Para members outside of competitions with the appropriate range access approval on their membership card.</p> <p>Para Members without range access approval, general SSAA members and visitors may only be permitted to use this range if under the supervision of a Para member with the appropriate range approval.</p> <p>The use of the metallic silhouettes on the top range is only to be used by members who have completed the relevant training. Training endorsement is shown on the members membership card. Members and visitors can use the silhouettes under the supervision of the approved member.</p> <p>The use of the key tag system is mandatory for all shooters and visitors going forward of the firing line. The RO is to take the first key tag out to turn on the red light on and close the range. The RO will also be the last one to insert the key tag back in and declare the range open.</p> <p>Registered competitions have right of usage over general practice users.</p> <p>All targets are to be set so that the projectiles impact the centre of the back stops.</p>



<b>Range:</b>	Field Shotgun Range
<b>No. Benches / Targets</b>	Varies
<b>Distances</b>	Varies
<b>Firearm Restrictions</b>	This Range is accredited for Shotgun
<b>Usage Restrictions</b>	<p>Range access is available to all Para members outside of competitions with the appropriate range access approval on their membership card.</p> <p>Para Members without range access approval, general SSAA members and visitors may only be permitted to use this range if under the supervision of a Para member with the appropriate range approval.</p> <p>A minimum of 2 people must be present outside of competitions.</p> <p>The use of the clay throwers on the shotgun range is only to be used by members who have completed the relevant training. Training endorsement is shown on the members membership card.</p> <p>The use of the key tag system is mandatory for all shooters and visitors going forward of the firing line. The RO is to take the first key tag out to turn on the red light on and close the range. The RO will also be the last one to insert the key tag back in and declare the range open.</p> <p>Registered competitions have right of usage over general practice users.</p> <p>No solids are to be used. Number 7 shot is the largest shot size to be used on the shotgun range.</p> <p>The RO is to check that the main range is not being used for 300yds prior to starting and that the sign is up.</p> <p>The use of the key tag system is mandatory for all shooters and visitors going forward of the firing line. The RO is to take the first key tag out to turn on the red light on and close the range. The RO will also be the last one to insert the key tag back in and declare the range open.</p> <p>Registered competitions have right of usage over general practice users.</p>





<b>Range:</b>	Air Pavilion
<b>No. Benches / Targets</b>	20
<b>Distances</b>	10m
<b>Firearm Restrictions</b>	This range is limited to Air Rifles & Air Pistols only
<b>Usage Restrictions</b>	This range is open to all users.  Registered competitions have right of usage over general practice users.
